DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-23.5-3-1.5.

Synopsis: Occupational therapy services. Allows an occupational therapist to provide occupational therapy services to an individual during a period of not more than 42 calendar days beginning on the day on which the occupational therapist first provides occupational therapy services to the individual. Allows an occupational therapist to provide occupational therapy services to an individual after the 42 day period only if the occupational therapist obtains a referral from, or acts on the order of, a physician, podiatrist, advanced practice registered nurse, psychologist, chiropractor, optometrist, or physician's assistant. Allows an occupational therapist, without a referral or order from a health care provider, to provide: (1) ergonomic or home assessment services; (2) injury or illness prevention education and wellness services; (3) occupational therapy activities that the medical licensing board of Indiana determines to be appropriate to be conducted in a community based environment.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

SENATE BILL No. 59

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 25-23.5-3-1.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.129-2018, 2 SECTION 36, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 3 JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 1.5. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), An 4 occupational therapist may not provide occupational therapy services 5 to a person until the person has been referred to the occupational 6 therapist by, or the occupational therapist is acting on the order of, an 7 individual during a period of not more than forty-two (42) 8 calendar days beginning on the day on which the occupational 9 therapist first provides occupational therapy services to the 10 individual.

(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), to provide occupational
therapy services to an individual after the period referred to in
subsection (a), the occupational therapist must obtain a referral
from, or act on the order of, one (1) of the following:

(1) A physician or osteopathic physician licensed under IC 25-22.5.

(2) A podiatrist licensed under IC 25-29.



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1	(3) An advanced practice registered nurse licensed under
2	IC 25-23.
3	(4) A psychologist licensed under IC 25-33.
4	(5) A chiropractor licensed under IC 25-10.
5	(6) An optometrist licensed under IC 25-24.
6	(7) A physician assistant licensed under IC 25-27.5.
7	The occupational therapist shall report to the practitioner as specified
8	by the practitioner who provided the referral or order. However, if the
9	practitioner does not specify a reporting requirement, the occupational
10	therapist shall report to the practitioner upon completion or termination
11	of occupational therapy services.
12	(b) (c) An occupational therapist may provide the following services
13	without a referral or order from a person health care provider listed
14	in subsection (a): (b)(1) through (b)(7):
15	(1) Ergonomic or home assessment.
16	(2) Injury or illness prevention education and wellness services.
17	(3) Occupational therapy activities provided in an educational
18	setting.
19	(4) Occupational therapy activities that the board determines,
20	after reviewing the recommendations of the committee, are
21	appropriate to be conducted in a community based environment.
