## **SENATE BILL No. 82**

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-23.6.

**Synopsis:** Mental health diagnosis. Defines "mental health diagnosis" and sets forth requirements that must be met in order for certain licensed professionals to provide a mental health diagnosis. Requires certain mental health professionals who are making a mental health diagnosis and who determine that the patient has not been examined by a physician in the preceding 12 months to recommend to the patient that the patient schedule an examination by a physician at the earliest opportunity. Requires notation of that recommendation in the patient's medical record.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
