HOUSE BILL No. 1141

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-15-1.3-24; IC 12-21-5-8; IC 25-1-9.5-3.5.

Synopsis: Mental health. Requires the office of the secretary of family and social services to apply for a state Medicaid waiver to reimburse providers who provide behavioral health services to committed offenders held by the department of correction. Requires the division of mental health and addiction to: (1) establish a plan to expand the use of certified community behavioral health clinics in Indiana; and (2) make certain considerations in preparing the plan. Expands the application of the telehealth statute to additional practitioners.

Effective: July 1, 2022.
